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Headteacher's news: school closure week1


Happy New Year! It certainly hasn't started well but let's hope the whole of 2021 is a better one for all of us.

In the Autumn Term, I surveyed you all about home learning. The graph below shows the responses you gave to one of the key questions: 'What remote learning would work best for your child?'
