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Headteacher's news:

It has been a productive week in school with no further bubble closures and focussed teaching and learning throughout.

Some children accessed additional catch-up lessons after school this week and these have gone well. Throughout COVID times, Headteacher representatives across the city have attended meetings with the Dave Clark (Head of Learning Improvement). In the meeting last week, discussions took place about the Education Recovery Strategy being led by Sir Kevan Collins. He is against the notion and the use of the phrase 'catch-up' and is more focussed on the term 'recovery'. There have been at least 115 school days impacted by the pandemic and he has stated that the recovery is going to take a number of years. He has also said that these three Ts are essential to recovery:

- Teaching especially quality first teaching
- Tuition including interventions
- Time unaffected schooling time as well as time to access after school provisions and wider curriculum activities.

I am going to move forward in line with the commissioner and begin to use the word recovery when I talk about the education of the pupils at Rufford Park. I do feel that we are meeting the expectations of the three T's above. The last T refers to providing opportunities to have more time accessing provision in the form of after school clubs and experiences. Our football club started before Easter, curriculum swimming lessons are going well and Y3 and Y4 are looking forward to their educational visit to Nell Bank next week. These all contribute to the well-being of our pupils and we will look to build upon these in the coming months.
