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### Headteacher's news:

It has been a good week in school. The children have remained focused and have carried on with their normal timetabled lessons - keeping to routines is always important in school when we approach the end of a term or a school year. Saying that, on Monday afternoon the children in Nursery and Reception enjoyed attending the school disco (not quite normal lessons...) and the rest of the school were able to attend after school on either Monday and Wednesday.

On Tuesday, you should have received your child's school report which I hope you found informative. The children have amazed me this year. They have probably had the toughest 16 months that they will ever have during their time in education. The resilience and determination that the children have shown to do their very best has been admirable and I would like to thank everyone from the children to the staff to the parents and carers for the part we have all played with this.

The NHS have now taken over the responsibilities for test and trace. Educational settings are no longer required to identify contacts and will not play a role with this in the first 6 days of the holidays. If your child does test positive for Covid-19 over the next few days, you will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace.

A new risk assessment has been circulated to all schools to use and adapt for September. I only received this yesterday and will publish on the website in due course. The main points to note for parents are: continued staggered timings, continued one way systems and no mask wearing required outside.
