

**Living with Covid:** The 1 April 2022 saw the removal of the requirement to have Covid specific risk assessments as part of the move to 'Living with Covid'. In line with this guidance, and building on the good practices schools have put in place regarding hygiene, cleaning, hand washing and ventilation, LCC H&S Team have now produced a sample Infection Prevention and Control in Schools Risk Assessment for schools to adopt. The basis of this risk assessment is that many of the controls that have been in place for Covid-19 also have benefits for managing other infectious illnesses that tend to arise in schools and provides a baseline for infection prevention and control that helps with all of these.
